

Principal's Message → Annual Report

We set out on a journey this year to be better than ever and were able to accomplish great things in several sectors. As Vince Lombardi said, "Perfection is not attainable, but if we chase perfection we can catch excellence." Aurora has always endeavoured to chase perfection.

Australis bears a testimony to all our efforts in pursuit of perfection and our meticulous approach. I congratulate the editorial board and every member who has helped us put together Australis – a unique experience for all Aurorians and a delightful insight into the beautiful world of Aurora. Now, with immense pleasure, I present to you Aurora's Annual Report for the academic year 2016-2017. We have once again proven that we are one of the best institutes in India, offering a fulfilling education across various streams such as Commerce, Management, Physical Sciences, Biological Sciences and Humanities. This year, the college admitted more than 1300 students in the various streams. We are glad to announce that we introduced the Mass Communication course from this academic year. The results of our students in the Annual Examinations held in April 2016 have been extremely good.

At Aurora, it's not just about the prescribed learning. A human body requires all the parts to function efficiently. This is the logic we apply when we nurture our students. Academics and extra-curricular activities are given equal importance to mould our students into perfect global citizens.



We began this academic year with welcoming the freshers into our portals. Our Induction Programme - Parichay, was held on 16th July, 2016 at the RTC Kalabhavan. The main objective of this program is to introduce the students to constituents of Aurora and provide an insight into what Aurora does to boost their career plans. It's also an event where a promise is made to the parents that their wards shall be molded for the better. The students were given an overview about the happenings in the college and were welcomed into the Aurora family by pledging to cherish the name of the institution. This was followed by the graduation ceremony for the outgoing batch of students. Samavartan, a mini Convocation, was held on the 23rd of July at RTC Kalabhavan, and witnessed the honoring of 584 graduates.

It's important to keep up with the ever-changing world. Methods of an older era and the limited information in books aren't sufficient to bring about a positive change in our faculty and students. Hence various academic pursuits are organized such as – conferences, workshops, seminars and industrial visits. The Department of Computer Science conducted a two-day National Conference on Information and Communication Technologies Research – Challenges and Opportunities. The objective of this event was to provide a platform for exchanging ideas on innovations in ICT Research and for students to interact with Scientists and Industrialists. A One-Day workshop on 'Business Analytics

using R' was organized by the Department of Statistics, to give the students an extensive hands-on experience on the R statistical software. An Investor Education Program was organized by the Department of Commerce in association with Bombay Stock Exchange to create awareness on the opportunities and risks related to Capital Market. The Department of Physics and Electronics conducted an Adjunct Course on "Circuit Design, PCB making, and Testing" for the students of B.Sc(M.E.Cs) and B.Sc(M.P.Cs) in collaboration with Innovative technologies. Apart from this, students were taken on industrial visits to NSIC, NGRI and ICRISAT.

Continuing with the academic fervor, the students and faculty at Aurora are encouraged to be actively involved in research. Several of our students bagged summer internships with leading research institutes. One of them is Yashowanth K of B.Sc BtBiC II who has been selected for the Jawaharlal Nehru Centre for Advanced Scientific Research (JNCASR) Summer Internship at Bangalore, for POBE for 3 consecutive years.

I'm also glad to inform you that Aurora's Research journal "Antharmukha" is being released regularly. Our faculty members use this opportunity to publish their articles. Apart from this, our faculty have presented and published papers in various national and international conferences. They have also taken life memberships in various organizations.

The Placement Council of our college has worked systematically in order to guide the students onto the right career path. The students have been rigorously trained on interview etiquettes, JAM \oplus Group Discussions. Orientation sessions have been organized for the students by the faculty and the HR managers to prepare them for interviews.

Aurora's Placement Council has successfully placed more than 263 students till date in different top listed companies such as Deloitte, Verizon, TCS, Amazon, United Health Group, ADP, Franklin Templeton, IBM, UBER, HGS EBOS, Genpact, Concentrix, Sutherland, Elyns Group, ICICI Prudential etc., with a minimum package of 2 lakhs per annum to the highest package of 4 lakhs per annum.

The NCC unit at Aurora has reigned supreme and represented our college at various levels. They have participated in camps at the international, national and state levels, bringing laurels to Aurora. S. Kuldeep of B.Com III Comp C attended the Youth Exchange Program held in Singapore. Three of our cadets were selected for the Republic Day Camp at New Delhi. Two cadets went for All India Trekking camp. Several other cadets bagged prizes in the inter-collegiate cultural competitions.

Our college also has two NSS units and our students have consistently contributed to noble causes. This academic year, the NSS wing at Aurora was actively involved in taking up numerous initiatives. National Voluntary Blood Donors' Day was observed on 1st Oct'2016. To mark the occasion, a rally was flagged off at Aurora's Degree \ni P G College which concluded at the Sundaraya Kala Bhavan. Many of our faculty members and students donated blood. Principals of eight colleges, including our Principal Mr. Vishwanadham Bulusu were felicitated. NSS program Officer, Mr. Malleshwar and Mrs. Megharani Giri were also appreciated for their contributions towards the program. NSS day was celebrated at JNFAU on 2nd Oct 2016. Our Alumna, Sunidhi Reddy, of B.com Hons stream was awarded the best NSS volunteer state award. She is the only NSS Volunteer to bag this award at the Osmania University level.

I'm also proud to tell you that, Aurora has maintained its goal to create a beautiful world, even though the world we live in is filled with negativity and trepidation. We believe that our students should understand the difference between right and wrong and also stand up to fight for the right causes. To empower young girls of various colleges in the twin cities, a workshop on "Cyber Security and Women Safety" was organized by the Women Empowerment Cell of Aurora in collaboration with She Teams and Hyderabad City Police on 23rd January, 2017, at Osmania Medical College, Koti Hyderabad.

Coming to the literary and cultural arenas, our students have performed exceedingly well, with countless achievements. We believe in providing the best platform to our students so that they discover and nurture their talents. 17 students of our college participated in Pulse 2016, a sociocultural fest organized by the All India Institute of Medical Science, New Delhi. Our students bagged prizes in quiz, beat-boxing, folk dance and athletics. Other outstanding achievers include Mohak Agarwal of B.com Hons III, who has won several prizes in Quiz and other commerce technical events at the state and national levels. Aneesh Bharathi of B. Com. Honors III is a budding tabla player, who has won prizes at the Osmania University Inter-Collegiate Cultural Competitions for three consecutive years, 2014 to 2016. Amulya Manja of BBA II is an accomplished classical dancer, who has bagged laurels at the state and national level.

We celebrated our annual literary and cultural intercollegiate fest – Abhiyaan on 9th Sep' 2016. The two-day fest was attended by more than 3000 students from across 50 colleges in Hyderabad, who participated in more than 45 different competitions. The Nukkad Natak saw teams delving into issues of anti-corruption and women empowerment.

Aurora's sports stars have always shined brightly under the expert quidance of our physical directors - Mr. Jaipal Reddy and Mr. Jaya Prakash. This year, our sportsmen have broken previous records and have won several awards. In the Osmania University Inter College Chess Tournament our college Chess Team Secured First Place. Our College Cricket Team was Runner up in the Rajeev Gandhi Yuva Khel T-20 Inter College Cricket Tournament for the year 2016-17. In ABVP Yuva Kranthi Youth Festival Inter-Collegiate Basket Ball Tournament our team secured 2nd Place. In the Sakshi Chess Tournament, Prateek Srivastava of MECs -3A bagged the First Prize and M. Sai Shashank of B.Com - 3D bagged the 2nd Prize.

The guest speakers for the event were Dr. Raghunadh Acharya, Mr. Madhu Sudhana Rao, Sr. Manager Nuevora Software Solutions, and Mr. Gopi Krishna, Scientific officer, ICRISAT. Dr. Acharya handled the first session on 'Business Analytics'. He discussed the process of examining large data sets containing a variety of data types. The second session was taken up by Mr. Rao, who enlightened the students on 'Statistical Techniques using R'. In the final session, Mr. Krishna demonstrated a

practical approach on R. The workshop was attended by more than a hundred participants, who had an enriching experience.

Micro Expo - 2016

Microbes play a key role in human welfare. Microbiology helps us understand the significance of good and bad microbes in our lives. Micro-Expo is an initiative by Aurora to inspire students to take up research in the field of medical microbiology and to enlighten the students on the proper use of antibiotics. The event was organized on the 5th & 6th of August. Several experiments related to medical microbiology were conducted. Students also displayed posters on the works and contributions of Alexander Fleming.

Seminar on Capital Markets

An Investor Education Program was organized in association with Bombay Stock Exchange on17th September to create awareness on the opportunities and risks related to Capital Market. Dr. Bhavanarayana Kandala was the resource person for this event. About 85 students participated in the event, which focused on several issues related to capital markets and reforms carried out by SEBI. Visit to NSIC

NSIC technical services centre, a recognized R&D centre by the Ministry of Service & Technology, Kamalanagar, ECIL Hyderabad, organizes workshops, seminar and Orientation programs for Engineering, Polytechnic, MBA and Degree

students to empower them for developing small industries. Orientation includes the lecture giving complete information to set up small industries such as taking Govt. approvals and preparing



project profiles. In the month of July, our students from the Physical Sciences stream participated in such a workshop. They also had the opportunity to interact with the NSIC officials and share their ideas in setting up small industries.

Visit to NGRI

Aurora has always believed in the concept of learning outside the classroom. On 17th October, our students attended NGRI's 'Open Day' Program. The visit helped students rekindle their interest in geophysics and allied sciences by participating in the exhibition. It illustrated the institution's work in areas from tsunami study and seismology-recording to planetary-volcanism and Marsquakes.

Visit to ICRISAT

The International Crops Research Institute for the Semi-Arid Tropics (ICRISAT) is an international organization, which conducts agricultural research for rural development, headquartered in Patancheru (Hyderabad), Telangana, India. The Department of Statistics planned this industrial trip to help the students learn about the hybrid yield of the corps, water management, tropical irrigation process, production lab and the ICRISAT Lake. A total of seventy students were accompanied by two faculty members. At ICRISAT, the students were shown two videos that explained about the rural farming communities and the watershed at the Kottapally village. The students then visited the agricultural sector where they learnt about the

modern techniques used in harvesting crops such as — Chickpea, Pigeonpea, Groundnut, Sorghum, Pearl millet and Finger millet.

Adjunct Course

The Department of Physics and Electronics conducted an Adjunct Course on "Circuit Design, PCB making, and Testing" for the students of B.Sc (M.E.Cs) and B.Sc (M.P.Cs) in collaboration with Innovative technologies. The duration of the course was from 1st to 31st December, 2016. In this course, students were taught basics of Electronic components, designing simple circuits using Proteus software, various steps involved in PCB making process, soldering components on PCB board, and testing the circuits. As a part of this course, students designed "Solar Battery Charger Circuit". The students had a hands-on experience about the electronic components.

Library Day

Norman Cousins aptly said, "A library is the delivery room for the birth of ideas, a place where history comes to life." Libraries play a major role in shaping young minds- be it academic pursuits or vocational interests. Aurora understands their importance and our library, Sharada Mandir, has been designed to enrich the lives of the students. The Library Day was celebrated on 9th January, 2017 in our Auditorium to further the cause. The guests for the day were Dr. B. Ravi, Deputy Librarian, HCU, Dr. Surya Prakash, Chief Functionary, Life-HRG and Mr. Pramod Chaitanya - Senior Analyst, Deloitte. Cuba's Dark Knight

"A revolution is a struggle to the death between the future and the past"

Fidel Castro was one the main reasons for establishing Cuba as the nation we've come to know today. He's called a Dictator and a Barbarian and was one of the most gruesome leaders the world has ever witnessed. Yes, he was barbaricto the Capitalists nations who wanted to exploit Cuba and its people. The people of Cuba, however, had placed him in their hearts.

Fidel Castro is a political leader of Cuba (1959–2008), who transformed his country into the first communist state in the Western Hemisphere. Castro became a symbol of communist revolution in Latin America. He held the title of Premier until 1976 and then began a long tenure as President of the Council of State and the Council of Ministers. He handed over provisional power in July 2006 because of health problems and formally relinquished the Presidency in February 2008. Meantime, Castro created a one-party government to exercise dictatorial control over all aspects of Cuba's political, economic, and cultural life. All political dissent and opposition were ruthlessly suppressed. Many members of the Cuban upper and middle classes felt betrayed by these measures and chose to immigrate to the United States. At the same time, Castro vastly expanded the country's social services, extending them to all classes of society on an equal basis. Educational and health services were made available to Cubans free of charge, and every citizen was guaranteed employment. The Cuban economy, however, failed to achieve significant growth or to reduce its dependence on the country's chief export, cane sugar. Economic decision-making power was concentrated in a centralized bureaucracy headed by Castro, who proved to be an inept economic manager. With inefficient industries and a stagnant agriculture, Cuba became increasingly dependent on favorable Soviet trade policies to maintain its modest standard of living in the face of the United States' continuing trade embargo.

Castro remained Premier until 1976, when a new constitution created a National Assembly and Castro became president of that body's State Council. He retained

the posts of commander in chief of the armed forces and secretary-general of the Communist Party of Cuba—the only legal political party—and he continued to exercise unquestioned and total control over the government.



Castro's brother Raúl, Minister of the Armed forces, ranked second to him in all government and party posts.

Fidel Castro's early attempts to foment Marxist revolutions elsewhere in Latin America foundered, but Cuban troops did eventually serve as proxies for the Soviet Union in various conflicts in less-developed countries. From 1975 to 1989, Cuban expeditionary forces fought in the Angolan civil war on the side of the communistic Popular Movement for the Liberation of Angola. In 1978, Cuban troops assisted Ethiopia in repelling an invasion by Somalia. In the 80s, Castro emerged as one of the leaders of the less-developed world and the nonaligned countries, despite his obvious ties to the Soviet Union. He continued to signify his willingness to renew diplomatic relations with the United States, provided that it ends its trade embargo against Cuba. In 1980, Castro released a flood of immigrants to the United States, when he opened the port of Mariel for five months. The 125,000 immigrants, including some criminals, strained the capacity of U.S. immigration and resettlement facilities.

In the late 1980s, when the Soviet Union under Mikhail Gorbachev began to undertake democratic reforms and eastern European countries were allowed to slip out of the Soviet orbit, Castro retained a hard-line stance, espousing the discipline of communism. The collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991 took him by surprise and meant the end of generous Soviet subsidies to Cuba. Castro countered the resulting economic decline and shortages of consumer

goods by allowing some liberalization and free-market activities, while retaining tight controls over the country's political life. On July 31, 2006, he passed power on a provisional basis to Raúl in order to recover from surgery for a serious intestinal illness. It was the first time since the 1959 revolution that he ceded control. In February 2008, mere days before the National Assembly was to vote for the country's leader, Castro, who hadn't appeared in public for 19 months, officially declared that he wouldn't accept another term as President. His announcement that he was stepping down was made through a letter that was addressed to the country and posted on the Website of the official Communist Party newspaper, Granma. In part it read, "I do not bid you farewell. My only wish is to fight as a soldier of ideas."In the succeeding months, official photos were released of Castro in private meetings, and in July 2010, he made a public visit to the National Centre for Scientific Research in Havana. In September, on the eve of the release of the first volume of his memoirs, The Strategic Victory, he remarked to a reporter from the United States that, "the Cuban model doesn't even work for us anymore." Many took his comment as an admission of the failure of communism. However, he was quick to qualify his remarks in a speech that followed a few days later. Most analysts saw his remarks as offering support for Raúl's introduction of economic reforms that included a massive layoff of government employees as well as increased toleration of private enterprise. In 2011, stepped down as secretarygeneral of the Communist Party of Cuba and was succeeded by Raúl. Castro lived as one of the greatest communist leaders by his thoughts and his policies; in fact, he made a mark of himself of being a sovereign and democratic "dictator", that sums up his extraordinary journey.



In a deserted and weedy lot in Memphis, eleven-year old Mark Sway feels terrible introducing his younger brother to a gripping addiction – smoking. Things were about to get a lot worse and they were going to have to worry about more than Ricky's first smoke. The events that unfold in the following minutes would turn their lives topsy-turvy and make them wonder if they were living a nightmare. The chance encounter with a psychotic lawyer leaves Mark in possession of a deadly secret, one that wouldn't hesitate to claim his life.

Mark then becomes the 'client' to Reggie Love, a tough lawyer with a soft spot for abused children. Reggie is tested in many ways while handling the case of her precocious young client. Mark is a street-smart kid, robbed of his innocence and forced with the harsh reality of a broken house and an abusive parent. He grows up with distrust in humanity and a streak of independence. He develops a presence of mind, learns the ways of the world and is a survivor. Equipped with the experiences he has had, he embarks on a mission to free himself from the hopeless entanglement hat he's caught in- between the legal system and the mafia.

'The Client' starts on a captivating note but fails to keep up the tempo. The beginning grips you but from there it is all downhill. Most characters do not hold a strong identity. It is average on comparison with Grisham's other works. The end though was mildly suspenseful.

On a positive note, it is a fast and easy read and made me break into a smile intermittently, specially at seeing a kid outsmart the judicial system.

A Tiger for Malgudi

"A Tiger for Malgudi," the novel authored by R.K. Narayan, is an account of the life of Raja, a tiger from the wild, who narrates his own story in the first person. The novel begins with the tiger reminiscing his life in the jungle with his mate and children; and proceeds to describe the attack meted out by the hunters, in which his litter and mate are killed. He avenges them by killing the cattle in the neighbouring village. However, he's captured and is made a part of circus, where he spends some happy time. Soon his primal instincts take over and he kills the owner of the circus, escapes and wreaks havoc in the village. He is once again captured, but this time by a monk. The tiger finds the company of the monk soothing, tranquil and peaceful. But this does not last long because the monk, who is an aging man, realizes that he cannot keep the tiger with him forever. He donates the tiger to the local zoo, where the animal is taken care of and is admired by the visitors.

As the story unfolds we see the author expressing his concern over the poaching of animals which, even today, remains a serious issue. The life of Raja is seen to take a complete spin of fortune wheel, with human beings controlling the environment and its inhabitants. Humans are the authorities and human characteristics are attributed to animals and inanimate objects. The imperialistic attitude of people has been reflected in situations like moving the tiger to circus, to zoo, making it behave according to whims of people and finally leaving it as a piece of entertainment at the zoo. This tendency, called Anthropocentrism, can be seen throughout the book. The tiger is projected as capable of thinking, feeling and behaving like humans; it is also more humane than the hunters, captain of the circus and the caretakers of the zoo. The tiger is given a human voice, a soul that is human and the animal view point has been thoroughly neglected.

Though the novel managed to depict the contrasting features of wild life and the civilized life of the village, it failed to acknowledge the true power and prowess of the protagonist, the tiger because towards the end, it was

made to merely entertain people. Using the medium of the novel, the author addressed the issue that is of concern even today, that is, the self centered nature of human being and also the callousness with which they treat other species of the planet. One can hope that this book serves as an eye opener for all.

Mustaine : A Life In Metal Memoir

- By Dave Mustaine, Joe Layden

Metal music has always been the most misconceived and

less understood genre of the music. It has been a source of social controversy since its early beginnings due to its themes and profanity. It started out as a new age form of rock. Heavy metal brought a new look and sound to rock. The early heavy metal musicians decided to tune their guitars down, increase the tempo, play guitars and drums faster, and get a more grungy sound. While



the current music industry thrives on the disreputable and glorified musicians using "synthesized material" and electronic tapes, little do people understand the mastery involved in creating an anthem out of a few guitars and drums. Metal is like biology and nature. It has vivid roots and a large number of sub-genres. Metal musicians come from a large spectrum of backgrounds. This leads to a diversification of the type of music they create, which leads to a huge number of permutations and combinations of lyrical and musical themes.

David Scott Mustaine is an American musician, best known as the lead vocalist of the metal band, Megadeth. Prior to his creation of "the perfect beast ... the perfect band," Mustaine was a member of Metallica in the heavy-metal

"thrash" scene in the 1980s. Kirk Hammett replaced Mustaine as a result of his battles with drugs and alcohol, and his personality conflicts with band members. From his early, crazy days as a founding member of Metallica, Dave Mustaine has seen and experienced everything in the world of rock n' roll. From his young triumphs and ignominious ouster from the band for his hard-partying ways to his later rule over Megadeth, one of the most successful heavy metal bands of all time, this autobiography tells it all.

This book, though at first might seem like it caters to only a niche audience, can be read by anyone who wants to have an insight into ardent metalheads. It's also for people who want to understand what it takes to live life. I personally found this book very thought-provoking and inspirational. It rubbishes the nonsense spread by a large group of people who aren't competent enough to understand the intricacies and eccentricity of Metal music.

His journey began with his band "Panic". This would turn out to be a brief stint as he soon came to be associated with the biggest metal band in the world, METALLICA. In his own words, Mustaine remembers his first meeting with James Hetfield and Lars Ulrich: "I was in the room warming up and I walked out and asked, 'Well, am I gonna audition or what?', and they said, 'No, you've got the job.' I couldn't believe how easy it had been and suggested that we get some beer to celebrate."The then members, James Hetfield, Lars Ulrich, Ron McGovney and Mustaine, would go on to create Kill em All, the cornerstone of what is considered to be the essential metal albums of modern history.

Mustaine never forgot that he was expelled from METALLICA years ago, and he won't let anyone else forget, seemingly unable to get through an interview without mentioning his former bandmates. It's also the tip of the iceberg for Mustaine, whose brashness, ego and flat-out craziness makes him one of metal's most fascinating figures, and makes his memoir a blast to read. "Meet the real me," indeed.

Fuelled with anger, aggression, hate and misery, he would then start his own band just so he can, MEGADETH. This band is, till date, a very traditional example of what thrash

metal sounds like. Though Dave didn't realize it then, but his attempt to piss off his ex band had giving birth to one of the most influential bands in the world. This books details the history of Megadeth and the release of some critically and commercially well received albums like Killing Is My Business... and Business Is Good!, Peace Sells... but Who's Buying?, So Far, So Good... So What!, Rust in Peace, Countdown to Extinction.

In 2002, Mustaine was admitted to the hospital to get a kidney stone removed. While undergoing treatment, he was administered pain medication that triggered a relapse. Following his hospital stay, he immediately checked himself into a treatment center in Texas. While at rehab, Mustaine suffered an injury causing severe nerve damage to his left arm. The injury, induced by falling asleep with his left arm over the back of a chair, caused the compression of the radial nerve. He was diagnosed with radial neuropathy, also known as Saturday Night Palsy, which left him unable to grasp or even make a fist with his left hand. This did not stop the musical psychopath he is. He disbanded Megadeth and spent hard hours in physiotherapy to literally "re-teach" his left hand. This shows the sheer dedication and zeal one should have to do what they love. We complain about a lot of things in life, whine and bicker over it, but some people are just not made to give up. Dave is one such individual.

At the same time, Mustaine's personal life once again underwent a change. It was during this period that Mustaine became a Christian. He expressed his intent to withdraw from a show in Greece that had Rotting Christ and Dissection opening for Megadeth. He later said in an interview, "Looking up at the cross, I said six simple words, 'What have I got to lose?' Afterwards my whole life has changed. It's been hard, but I wouldn't change it for anything. Mustaine also considers his talent a gift from God. Till date he refuses to play with satanic bands.

The entire book takes us through his life- from his teenage years and till the most recent happenings in his life. He's had a tough time of it. Some might say that's down to his extreme arrogance and abrasive personality, others would say he's strong willed and a perfectionist. I'm sure the truth is somewhere in the middle, but nothing can take away

from the fact that this autobiography is a remarkably open account of his many years in metal. He's been through drug and alcohol addictions, musical highs and lows, and about a hundred different lineups of Megadeth, before sobering up, losing the ability to play the guitar, finding God, and returning to music and metal. Through all that, he has retained his own vision of what thrash metal should be, and no matter what you may think of some of his output, his relentless pursuit of his muse makes for a very interesting tale. This is what the readers can take from the story.

Mustaine's countless conflicts with Megadeth members (18 to date) from past to present reveal his perfectionism. He runs the band as a business. But he makes amends along the way, and each conflict comes to some sort of resolution in the end. The many lineups of Megadeth are covered, with Mustaine being brutally honest about why people were fired, and why some got more than one chance. His honesty can't be questioned after he admits that Marty Friedman's departure from the band may well have been down to Friedman being a better musician than Mustaine. One thing that has always come across, through all the arrogance and posturing, is his intelligence, which explains why you find yourself shouting at him from time to time, as he heads down yet another chemical avenue.

Dave Mustaine is a legend in heavy metal. He has written music that has inspired generations of fans, and has proven that with faith, anything is possible. Transcending simple religion and music, Mustaine's Heavy Metal Memoir will leave you moved and inspired. The story of his redemption and return to music makes for an unusual ending to a book, as it's not something you encounter every day as bands today no longer have the conviction and integrity in the world of heavy metal. It's a story well told, and anyone who grew up with thrash metal will find this a thoroughly enjoyable read. Non-believers and critics would be shamed for their words, but it's safe to say that Metal would accept them without any prejudices and help them seek solace in the beauty of the beast.

Movie Review

La La Land

Their love story is underlined with Classical Music

The plain secret about writing movie reviews is that, it is much more difficult to write a review for good movie than it is a bad movie. One can pass judgment on bad movies easily but while writing about a great movie, one experiences an immense sense of responsibility – filled with honor and



respect for what the filmmaker has presented to us. In case of 'La La land', it is the cinematic brilliance adopted by Damien Chazelle in the magical hours that deserve glory. This is why I struggle to write about this fascinating piece of art, which is undoubtedly one of the most absorbing movies I've ever watched – it has a charisma that doesn't allow the viewer to take the eyes off screen.

Original in its concept, 'La La Land' tells the love story of struggling actress and a passionate musician in Los Angeles, in a genre extinct in cinema — the original Hollywood musical. Chazelle's alchemy of converting bronze to gold can be seen right from the opening sequence, which I would call one of the greatest opening scenes in cinema- an intoxicating moment where the director declares his intentions with a smile-to-the-heart dance sequence in sunny Los Angeles. The camera never cuts in this long take and visual composition induces a hypnotizing effect, which heaves the audience into the magical land of Mia and Sebastian. This sequence is cinematic magic; the whole movie reinforces this magic in a story told through musical forms of dancing and singing, which occur as natural progressions of an ongoing scene. The skilled craft and

palpable delight overwhelm us- especially during the last 20 minutes. I could barely feel the ground beneath my feet and was absolutely weightless.

On one side, the film celebrates seasons of love, spanning sweet, sad and rejoicing moments, and on the other, it explores the struggle of being an artist and reconciling dreams with the need to be a human. The characters have different ways of looking at art – Sebastian believes if art is great, it doesn't matter if no one likes it, while Mia believes art needs an audience. The chemistry between these contrasting perspectives is beautifully acted by Ryan Gosling and Emma Stone. Gosling, with his unflinching charm, reflects Sebastian's passion for original jazz, while Emma Stone is brilliant in her career's best performance. The whole theory of the film is summed up in the exchange of a glance between the lead characters. The song and dance styling suits the movie's modern-day setting with correct spice of nostalgia and the actors perform with beauty and perfection. The tap dance in the song, 'A Lovely Night' is my most favorite dance sequence in cinema.

Passion and love have always worked better with a soundtrack. La La Land' is a combination of Sebastian's passion for dying jazz and Mia's struggle to be an actress. Their love story and the whole narrative style are underlined with classical music. Chazelle explores cinema's capability in taking the viewer on a tour of the human psyche with music as a dimension — all credits to Justin Hurwitz who composed and orchestrated the original score. Filmed in CinemaScope, the film has a mesmerizing visual composition supported by well-designed costumes matching the overall frame construction; editing equaling surgical precision-every moment of the film was a delight!

A love letter to Hollywood musicals, with radiant jazz numbers, spellbinding colour scheme, smooth choreography and actors' chemistry, the film dances into one's heart and is one of my favorite movies of the year along with 'Arrival' & 'The Handmaiden'!

Hacksaw Ridge

family, faith, love and forgiveness, all put to the test in an arena of violent conflict

Mel Gibson has returned, with a war movie about ... peace. One may have problems with the director's history of violence. But they will have no issue with Hacksaw Ridge, a movie about a different type of a brave heart. It is the fact-backed, World War II peek into the heroics of Private First



Class, Desmond T. Doss, the first conscientious objector to receive the Congressional Medal of Honor. The taller 'spidey' Andrew Garfield, gives a career defining performance while playing the war hero. Desmond, a kid out of Virginia, who has sworn never to pick up a weapon of destruction owing to the fact that he almost killed his father because of one, is hell bent vehemently to go to war as a medic. Questions rise as to how this devoted Seventh-Day Adventist, one who does not work on the day of his sabbath, plans to enter the enemy's lines where one has to shoot to kill for staying alive. This is the crux of the film that takes us to the war front from the eyes of Mel Gibson, who gives us a glimpse of what took place in Okinawa before V-J day. The script from Robert Schenkkan and Andrew Knight unearths a raw nerve. Desmond Doss's father, Tom, played by the sublime Hugo Weaving, is traumatized by his past while serving in World War I that he enjoins his sons against enlisting. His kids, who have had no constraints in defying their father who abuses their mother while he is buzzed, defy him again. Desmond's brother, Hal Doss (Nathaniel Buzolic) enlists due to the events in Pearl Harbor. Our

protagonist, who is madly in love with Dorothy (the sterling Teresa Palmer), is still undecisive to enlist. While at Fort Jackson for training, there are renewed layers of meaning as Desmond shirks rifle practice. This bothers Sgt. Howell (Vince Vaughn, pulling of gruff) and his fellow recruits, who are deceived by his principles for cowardice. Efforts to drive this renegade out of the Army are made, even going to the extent of court-martial. Desmond's father comes to defense in an unexpected turn of events for his son. It's a huge tribute to Andrew Garfield's engagement to the role that he never lets the easy sentiment disorient the force of the Doss's conviction.

Undoubtedly, it's the scrimmage of war that fills Hacksaw Ridge with life, with Gibson and cinematographer Simon Duggan refusing to elude from the harsh realities of ground warfare. The rocky slope from which the film takes its title, is the Japanese stronghold that Desmond's battalion must destroy before they can take Okinawa. Gibson captures the most brutal and bloody screen carnage since his own Braveheart and the opening sequence of Steven Spielberg's Saving Private Ryan, yet another war movie. This is where Desmond stays behind as his troops are forced to pull out. He repeatedly returns amid bullets, bombs and grenade blasts, to round up wounded soldiers, 75 in all, and lower them by rope down the ridge and to safety.

Kudos to some of the greatest battle scenes ever filmed, Gibson once again shows his staggering gifts as a filmmaker, able to juxtapose savagery with aching tenderness. There's always been more than an adrenaline rush in his work: Look at Braveheart (for which he won the Oscar as best director), The Passion of the Christ (the most successful R-rated indie film of all-time) and the masterful yet misunderstood Apocalypto. Hacksaw Ridge is being touted as Gibson's comeback. What's clear is that Gibson has made a film about family, faith, love and forgiveness, all put to the test in an arena of violent conflict — a movie you surely don't want to miss.

(ప్రపంచం అభివృద్ధి చెందుతున్న సందర్భంలో సోషల్ మీడియాను మనం పక్కకు నెట్టలేం. కాని ఈ సోషల్ మీడియా యూత్కు ఒక అడిక్షన్ గా మారిపోయింది. ఒక గంట సేపు ఇది లేకపోతే ఏదో కోల్పోయాము అనే భావన. దీని వలన యువత ఆత్మహత్యల బాట పదుతున్నారు. దీని కోసం సుటీం కోర్టు సోషల్ మీడియా ఫై 66 IT act తెచ్చింది. సైబర్ లాను తెచ్చింది. సా వల్ మీదియాను మంచి వనులకు ఉవయోగించుకోవాలి. చెదు విషయాలకు ఉపయోగించరాదు. సెల్ప్ రిట్రిక్షన్ అవసరం. మనకు మన పరిమితులు విధించుకోవాలి. చెదు దారి పట్టకుండా మంచి మార్గమును ఎంచుకోవాలి. మంచి మీదియాలు, మంచి సమాచారాన్ని మనం పంచుకోవాలి.

సోషల్ మీడియాలో మితిమీరిన సంభాషణల వలన సంబంధాలు దెబ్బతింటాయి. కనుక మనకు మనము పరిమితులు విధించుకోవాలి.

సోషల్ మీడియాలో సమాచారం మనకు తొందరగా లభిస్తుంది. కాని అది ఎంతవరకు సరి అయినదో మనకు తెలియదు. అందువలన సోషల్ మీడియా పై పూర్తిగా ఆధారపడవద్దు. దీని వలన మన ఆలోచనా శక్తి తగ్గి పోతుంది. కనుక నమాచారం కోనం గ్రంథాలయాలకు వెళ్ళడం వలన అక్కడ కావలసిన దాని కంటే ఎక్కువ సమాచారం లభిస్తుంది. కొత్త విషయాలు నేర్చుకుంటాము. కావున సోషల్ మీడియా కంటే గ్రంథాలయాలలో ఎక్కువ సమయం గడిపితే (ప్రపంచ జ్ఞానం తెలుస్తుంది. ఆరోగ్యం బాగుంటుంది. మనస్సు ప్రహంతంగా ఉంటుంది.

"శరీరం కోసం వ్యాయామం చేయాలి! మనస్సు ప్రహాంతత కోసం చదవాలి!" ప్రపంచాన్ని మార్చే శక్తి ఒక పుస్తకంకి ఉంటుంది.

సామాజిక మాధ్యమాలు మన మానవులకు ఎంతో మేలు చేస్తుంది.

ఎందుకంటే సమాచారాన్ని కొన్ని క్షణాల్లో, కోట్ల, లక్షలు, వేల, వందల, పదుల మందికి చేరవేయవచ్చును. అందుకనే నీటి విద్యార్థులకు ఇది ఒక వరంగా మారి ఎన్నో కొత్త విషయాలు, విలువైన సమాచారం తెలుసుకొనగలిగే మాధ్యమంగా మారింది.

కాని కొందరు విద్యార్థులేకానీ ఎవరైనా మితిమీరి సామాజిక మాధ్యమాన్ని దుర్వినియోగం చేస్తున్నారు. ఈ ఫేస్బుక్, వాట్స్అప్లు మొదలైనవి కేవలం సమాచారం అందిపుచ్చుకోవడానికే ఉండాలి కాని అనవసరమైన విషయాలు, పనికిరాని విషయాలు ఈ మాధ్యమంలో ఉపయోగించి తమ తమ విలువైన సమాయాన్ని వృధా చేసుకోకూడదని నేను భావిస్తున్నాను. నేటి యువతరం గొప్ప లక్ష్యాలను పెట్టుకొని దాన్ని సౌకారం చేసుకునేందుకు అహర్నిశలు (శమించాలి. అప్పుడు మనం, మన సమాజం, మన భారతదేశం అభివృద్ధి చెందిన దేశంగా మారుతుంది.
