Book Review

To Kill a Mockingbird

To Kill a Mockingbird is fundamentally a novel that deals with coming of age and growing up in a tired old town of Maycomb, Alabama. The title refers to the local legend that it is a sin to kill a Mockingbird. This story itself is told in the first person by a six-year old girl, Scout, with the prose of a well-educated adult. Author Harper Lee has made an attempt to confine the information of the text to what Scout would actually know, but it is no more than a casual gesture toward plausibility.



Lee explores the setting and the irrationality of the adults with an exuberant sense of humor in the naive sense of Scout and Jem Finch, assisted by their friend, Dill. The story, as seen through the young eyes of Scout and her brother, Jem, illustrates the town, whose conscience is steeped in prejudice. The memoir grips our imagination through the vivid description of their father, Atticus, and his one-man battle against the townspeople to protect the story's real mockingbird, Tom, a black man, who is falsely charged with the rape of a white girl.

What makes 'To Kill a Mockingbird' truly unparalleled is not just Scout's refreshing innocence or the small town pre-reformation reality, but it is Atticus' staunchly indomitable spirit and his absolute ingenuity. From his epic speech in the courtroom that moves the reader to tears, to his simple and firm upbringing of his children, he stands a true role model even in modern literature. He is the real hero of the story as he struggles for justice in the contemptuous town, which refuses to see past its bigotry, even when the truth stares in its face. This shows his prodigious endurance and determination.

A variety of adults, mostly eccentric in Scout's judgment and a continuous bubble of incident, makes this novel a pleasant, laughter-evoking and undemanding read.

College Events

Pi-Day

Pi (Greek letter " π ") is the symbol used in mathematics to represent the ratio of the circumference of a circle to its diameter, which is approximately 3.14159. It continues infinitely without repetition, which makes for interesting challenges to calculate more and more digits beyond the decimal point. To enlighten the students on the history, importance and the application of Pi in Mathematics, Pi Day was celebrated on 22nd July at Aurora. Charts and posters were used to showcase the influence of Pi. Through presentations, the audience was educated on the ways in which Pi is used.

Micro Expo - 2016

Microbes play a key role in human welfare. Microbiology helps us understand the significance of good and bad microbes in our lives. Micro-Expo is an initiative by Aurora to inspire students to take up research in the field of medical microbiology and to enlighten the students on the proper use of antibiotics. The event was organized on the 5th & 6th of August. Several experiments related to medical microbiology were conducted. Students also displayed posters on the works and contributions of Alexander Fleming.

National Conference on Information and Communication Technologies Research

A two-day National Conference on Information and Communication Technologies Research – Challenges and Opportunities was organized by the Department of Computer Science on the 19th and the 20th of August at Aurora. The objective of this event was to provide a platform for exchanging ideas on innovations in ICT Research and for students to interact with Scientists and Industrialists. Researchers from different fields such as Digital Image Processing and Bio-Informatics were invited to present their papers. After the Plenary Session by Dr. Kannan



Srinathan, papers were presented by the participants. The forenoon session was chaired by Dr.Kannan Srinathan and the afternoon session by Prof. Radhakrishna. On the second day a lecture on Big Data Analytics was given by Dr. A.V. Krishna Prasad, Professor, CSE Department, KLU. Certificates were presented to the participants during the valedictory function.

Seminar on Capital Markets

An Investor Education Program was organized in association with Bombay Stock Exchange on 17th September to create awareness on the opportunities and risks related to Capital Market. Dr. Bhavanarayana Kandala was the resource person for this event. About 85 students participated in the event, which focused on several issues related to capital markets and reforms carried out by SEBI. The speaker educated the audience about the precautions to be taken while investing in stock markets.

World Tourism Day

Tourism has several benefits, including economic and infrastructure growth. To foster awareness among students about the importance of tourism, a World Tourism Day event was celebrated on 27th September. Charts were displayed to show the social, cultural, political and economic values that are developed through tourism. A photo gallery competition of the best tourist destinations was also conducted.

IT Club-Event

On the 20th of every month, an event is conducted by Aurora's IT Club to facilitate learning beyond the classroom. 'Introduction to Ethical Hacking' was the topic chosen for the month of July. The ability to assess and measure threats to information assets was discussed.

NGRI Visit

Aurora has always believed in the concept of learning outside the classroom. On 17th October, our students attended NGRI's 'Open Day' Program. The visit helped students



rekindle their interest in geophysics and allied sciences by participating in the exhibition. It illustrated the institution's work in areas from tsunami study and seismology-recording to planetary-volcanism and Mars-quakes.



World Osteoporosis Day

However, there are those of us who have to face some of the most difficult challenges. Osteoporosis is one such challenge. Movie Review

The Dark Knight

In general, there are certain norms in film-watching and despite the innovations in the field of cinema, those norms remain untouched. One among them is the hero-villain theory, where the audience takes the protagonist's side, no matter how convincing the antagonist is. Though there are many movies in the history of cinema that broke this pattern, such as *The Silence of Lambs* or *The Star Wars Series*, it is *The Dark Knight* that has the most significance in pop-culture. From tees to phone covers and internet memes, one can find the scarred face with green hair everywhere even 8 years after the film's release- such is the popularity of Heath Ledger's interpretation of the Joker. The credit here not only goes to the actor's unmatched performance but also to the character's portrayal adopted by the Nolan brothers.

Though it has the tag of a superhero movie, and a sequel to *Batman Begins*, *The Dark Knight* doesn't adopt the cinematic clichés of usual superhero movies. The film is more of a philosophical interpretation of DC's characters in a perfectly humane way. This is what made the movie special- there are no gravity-defying sequences or super-powered creatures; one can only see human nature exploring crime, self-guilt, societal living and punishment.

The plot of TDK revolves around the Joker influencing the fallen crime syndicate of Gotham city, taking it to unexpected levels to achieve personal satisfaction. Batman, on the other hand, makes desperate attempts to stop him amidst the emotional struggles with his alter ego, Bruce Wayne. The plot's aesthetic implication of Iraq War, American governmental system, societal standards and human tendency makes the movie more interesting.



The film is a marvel of cinematic excellence right from coloring to visual effects. Depending less on vfx, the movie had grand special effects in trademark Christopher Nolan style. His film-making standards are of exceptional levels- no wonder he is the best film maker of the current generation. Jonathan Nolan's scripting, supported by Christopher Nolan is of greater standards – greatest in the superhero genre. While Heath Ledger's Joker makes one go crazy, Christian Bale as Batman is controlled and mature, what an actor he is! Michael Cane, Maggie Gyllenhaal, Morgan Freeman & Gary Oldman as Inspector Gordon with Aaron Eckhart as Harvey Dent form a superior supporting cast.

The best thing about *The Dark Knight* is that it has all the great elements one would least expect from a superhero movie!

Faculty Column

Mobile Operating System

A mobile operating system is a set of data and programs that runs on a computer or mobile device. It manages all the hardware and optimizes the efficacy of the application software in the device. A mobile OS manages mobile multimedia functions, mobile and Internet connectivity and so on in a mobile device. Mobile OS' are seen in smartphones, tablets, and wearables . They are powered by platforms like

1. Symbian

Symbian OS is officially the property of Nokia. It means that any other company will have to take permission from Nokia before using this operating system. Nokia has remained a giant in the low-end mobile market, so after Java Symbian was the most used in the mobile phones till a couple of years ago. Still Symbian is widely used in low-end phones but the demand rate has been continuously decreasing. By upgrading Symbian mobile OS, Nokia has made it capable to run smartphones efficiently. Symbian ANNA and BELLE are the two latest updates that are currently used in Nokia's smartphones. Overall, the Symbian OS is excellently designed and is very user-friendly.

2. Android

September 20th, 2008 was the date when Google released the first Android OS by the name of 'Astro'. After sometime next upgraded versions 'Bender' and 'Cupcake' were also released. Google then adopted the trend of naming Android versions after any dessert or a sweet in alphabetical order. The other releases are Donut, Éclair, Froyo, Gingerbread, Honeycomb, Ice Cream Sandwich and Jelly Bean. Marshmallow (Android 6.0) is so far the latest Android version from Google. Since the

platform is not closed like iOS, there are too many great Android apps built by developers.. Google Play is an official app market that contains millions of different apps for Android devices. Samsung, HTC, Motorola and many other top manufacturers are using Android in their devices.

3. Apple iOS

iOS was introduced on 29th June 2007 when the first iPhone was developed. Since then iOS has undergone many upgrades and currently the latest one is iOS 9.

Apple has still not allowed any other manufacturer to lay hands on its operating system. Unlike Android, Apple has concentrated more on the performance along with appearance. This is the reason the basic appearance of iOS is almost the same as it was in 2007. Overall it is very user-friendly and is one of the mobile's best operating systems in the world. So far iOS is used in all iPhones, iPod & iPad.

4. Blackberry OS

Blackberry OS is the property of RIM (Research In Motion) and was first released in 1999. RIM has developed this operating system for its Blackberry line of smartphones. Blackberry is much different from other operating systems. The interface style, as well as the smartphone design, is also different having a trackball for moving on the menu and a qwerty keyboard. Like Apple, Blackberry OS is a close source OS and is not available for any other manufacturer. Currently, the latest release of this operating system is Blackberry OS 7.1 is used in Blackberry Bold 9930. It is a very reliable OS and is immune to almost all the viruses.

5. Windows OS

All of you will be familiar with Windows OS because it is used in computers all over the world. Windows OS has also been used in mobile phones, but normal mobile phone users find it a bit difficult to operate it but at the same time it was very popular among people who are used to it. The latest Windows release by Microsoft is known as Windows 7 which has gained immense popularity among all kind of users. With its colorful and user-friendly interface, it has given Windows OS a new life and is currently in demand all over the world. This latest OS is used in very powerful devices made by Nokia. Samsung and HTC also released some Windows-based phones. Nokia Lumia series is completely windows based. Some of the latest Windows Phones are Nokia Lumia 800, Nokia Lumia 900, Samsung Focus and HTC Titan 2.

6. BADA

Like others, Samsung also owns an operating system that is known as BADA. It is designed for mid-range and high-end smartphones. Bada is a quiet user-friendly and efficient operating system, much like Android, but unfortunately Samsung did not use Bada on a large scale for unknown reasons. The latest version Bada 2.0.5. These three smartphones are Samsung Wave, Samsung Wave 2 and Samsung Wave 3.

7. Palm OS (Garnet OS)

Palm OS was developed by Palm Inc in 1996 especially for PDAs (Personal Digital Assistance). Palm OS was designed to work on touchscreen GUI. Some Years later it was upgraded and was able to support smartphones. Unfortunately, it could not make a mark on the market and currently is not being used in any of the latest top devices.

8. Open Web OS

Open WebOS also known as Hp WebOS or just WebOS which was developed by Palm Inc but after some years it became the property of Hewlett-Packard. WebOS was launched in 2009 and was used in a number of smartphones and tablets.

9. Maemo

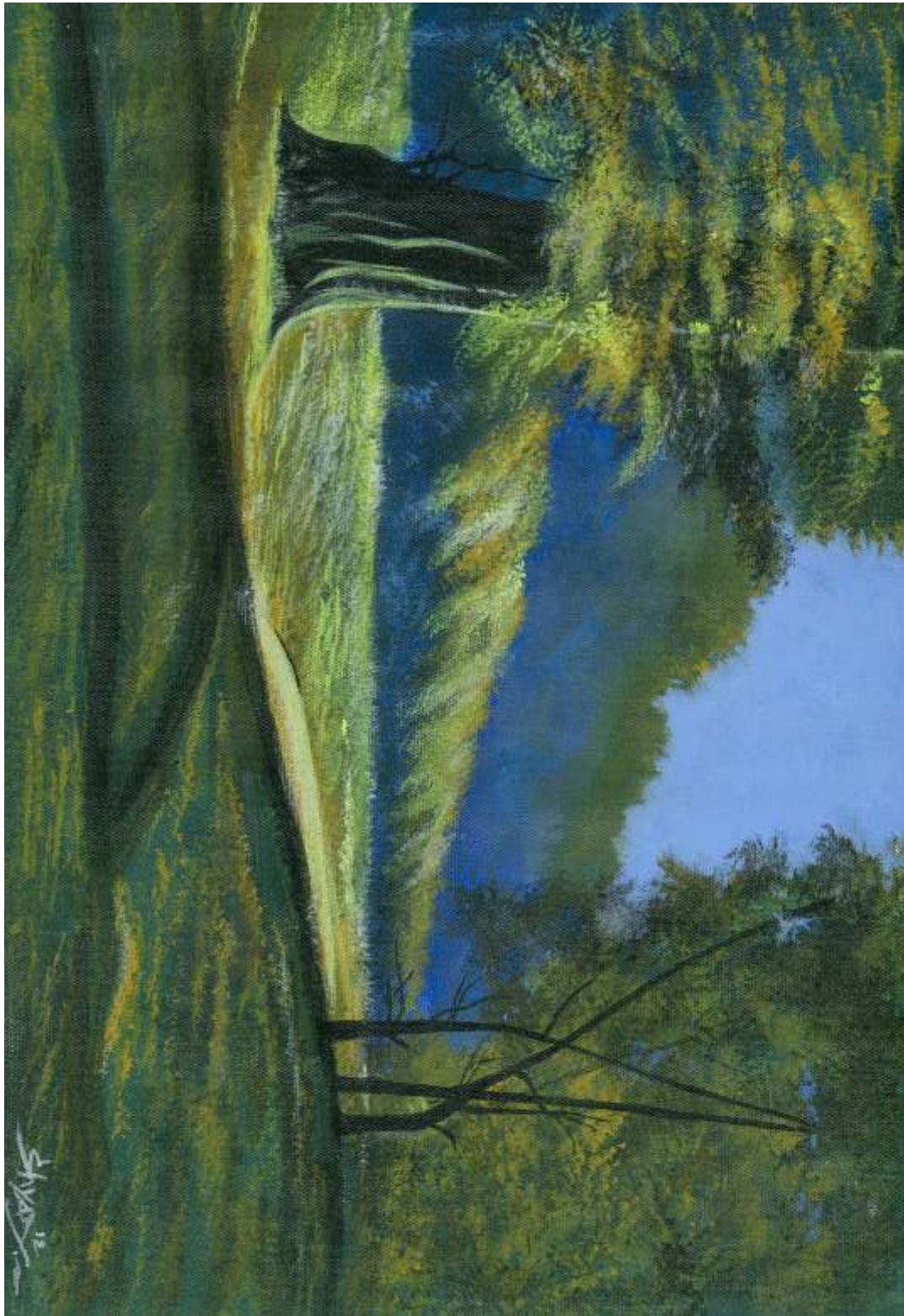
Nokia and Maemo Community joined hands to produce an operating system for smartphones and internet tablets, known as Maemo. Like other devices, the user interface of Maemo also comprised of a menu from which the user can go to any location.. Later in 2010 at the MWC (Mobile World Congress) it was revealed that now Maemo project will be merged with Mobilin to create a fresh operating system known as MeeGo.

10. MeeGo

MeeGo was called a mobile platform, but it was designed to run multiple electronic devices including handhelds, in-car devices, television sets, and net books. All the devices on which MeeGo can have the same core but the user interface is entirely different according to the device. In 2010, Moorestown Tablet PC was introduced at COMPUTEX Taipei, which was also a MeeGo powered device.
