Classic Brownie

Ingredients

- Butter 100g, chopped
- Dark chocolate 200g, chopped
- Eggs 4
- Golden caster sugar 250g
- Plain flour 100g
- Baking powder 1 tsp
- Cocoa 30g

Variations

White or milk chocolate chunks 100g, chopped hazelnuts 100g, toasted, roughly chopped. Pecans 100g, toasted, roughly chopped baby

marshma



Method

- Heat the oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4
- Line a 22cm square brownie tin with baking parchment. Melt the butter and chocolate together in a microwave or in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water. Cool to room temperature.
- Whisk the eggs and sugar together until the mixture is light and fluffy.
- Fold the chocolate mixture into the egg mixture and sift on the flour, baking powder and cocoa.
- Fold this in to give a fudgy batter
- (To ramp it up, add 100g chopped white or milk chocolate chunks OR 100g toasted, roughly chopped hazelnuts or pecans OR 2 handfuls of baby marshmallows.)
- Bake for 25-30 minutes or until the top is cracked but the middle just set. Cool completely, then lift out of the tin and cut.

Movie Review

SCHINDLER'S LIST -Genre:Drama

Directed By: Steven Spielberg



Schindler's list is based on the novel "Schindler's Ark". It is an epic American historical period Drama film. Liam Neeson portrays Oskar Schindler's Life during the Darkest Ages of History-The Holocaust!!

"Schindler's List" is really two parallel character studies--one of a con man, the other of a psychopath. Oskar Schindler, who swindles the Third Reich, and Amon Goeth, who represents its pure evil, are men created by the opportunities of war.

In "Schindler's List," Spielberg's brilliant achievement is the character of Oskar Schindler, played by Liam Neeson as a man who never, until almost the end, admits to anyone what he is really doing. Schindler leaves it to "his" Jews, and particularly to his accountant Itzhak Stern, played by Ben Kingsley, to understand that Schindler is using his factory as a congame to cheat the Nazis of the lives of his workers. Schindler leaves it to Stern. and Spielberg leaves it to us; the movie is a rare case of a man doing the opposite of what he seems to be doing, and a director letting the audience figure it out itself.

Some of the most dramatic scenes in the movie show Schindler literally snatching his workers from the maw of death. He rescues Stern from a death train. His insight here is that no one would walk into Auschwitz on such a mission if he were not the real thing. His very boldness is his shield. Schindler's List" gives us information about how Aurora's Degree & PG College



parts of the Holocaust operated, but does not explain it, because it is inexplicable that men could practice genocide. Or so we want to believe. In fact, genocide is a commonplace in human history, and is happening right now in Africa, the Middle East, Afghanistan, and elsewhere. The power of Spielberg's film is not that it explains evil, but that it insists that men can be good in the face of it, and that good can prevail.

At the end of the war, Schindler's Jews are in a strange land--stranded, but alive. A member of the liberating Russian forces asks them, "Isn't a town over there?" and they walk off toward the horizon. The next shot fades from black and white into color. At first we think it may be a continuation of the previous action, until we see that the men and women on the crest of the hill are dressed differently now. And then it strikes us, with the force of a blow: Those are Schindler's Jews. We are looking at the actual survivors and their children as they visit Oskar Schindler's grave. The movie began with a list of Jews being confined to the ghetto. It ends with a list of some who were saved. The list is an absolute good. The list is life. All around its margins lays the gulf.

Book Review

LITTLE WOMEN Louisa May Alcott, Collins Classics, 2010

Introduction to Little Women

The novel "Little Women" written by Louisa May Alcott was published by Roberts Brothers in the year 1868. The freshness of this novel which is the first volume of the series appealed to the readers so greatly that it was an instant success; initial copies published were sold quickly and kept the publishers on heels to publish more copies as an attempt to keep up with the overwhelming demand for the book. Little Men and Jo's Boys were produced and printed as its sequels.

About the author

The author, Louisa May Alcott was born in a family that believes in American Transcendentalism-a movement which arose either to support or protest against the spirituality and intellectualism. Alcott took up the profession of a nurse, during her time spent with patients her experiences helped to hone her story telling skill. Louisa, during her early days was a feminist and a humanitarian both of whom have been reflected in the novel.

The story

The story "Little Women" is a heartwarming tale about four sisters Jo, Amy, Beth and Meg. The backdrop of the story was American Civil War. The sisters grew up in the same environment but are very different from each other. Yet, they share a lovely and beautiful relationship with each other. The story expertly narrates the thin line of relationship between them and the efforts put in to be together in all situations.



Little Women was actually inspired by the author's personal life, for she had three sisters. The novel is a representation about the relationship she shared with her sisters. The main character Josephine March aka Jo is Louisa herself. Jo is described in the novel as a tomboy with furious temper. Louisa used Jo as a medium to vent out her frustration at the world's ill-treatment towards woman.

While reading the novel, the reader directly or indirectly can relate to the characters of the novel. Some instances make them chuckle or laugh as one can imagine how the sisters pass their time by either fooling around with each other or trying out new things. Few parts of the story make the readers happy as they can see the warmth shared by the characters with each other and with their parents. There are even chances of Jo becoming the reader's favorite because of her tomboy nature and the way she rants about a topic which she does not find pleasing.

Also there are incidents which might upset the reader, one such topic is the comparison between men and women and showing women as inferior beings. Nonetheless the novel is heart touching. The novel upholds

morals such as forgiving people's wrong doings; sticking to morals and improving them rather than focusing on weaker ones; and being supportive to each other during hard times.

Conclusion

The title "Little Women" can be interpreted in two ways owing to the environmental conditions-first, as an expression of the inferior treatment given to women in comparison to men in 19th century America. The title is also read as a statement about the general lack of significance of most people in the society. Since Alcott was a feminist the title has two meanings i.e., it is about women and the word "little" is used especially for mediocrity of women and for possessing little or no significance in the society during those times.

How does VFX in Indian films works?

Here's all you need to know.

With films like Baahubali, Robo, Eega, has India nailed the VFX game?

Gone are the days when computergenerated imagery (CGI) and Visual Effects (VFX) were the monopoly of Hollywood production giants.



The ability and resources to create unreal worlds have trickled down to India and how. Besides, VFX is no longer limited to the fantasy-fiction genre (for instance Baahubali, Ra.One etc) but is now being widely used to embellish even seemingly uncomplicated sequences.

Know how and why.

Booming industry:

Every big-budget Bollywood film of today uses computer-generated imagery (CGI)

India is currently home to over 300 animation, 40 VFX and 85 game-development studios, employing an estimated 15,000 working professionals.





Every big-budget Bollywood film of today uses on an average 500-1500 CGI shots to create believable thrills.

Most of the crowd/stadium scenes are VFX created (for instance in Bhaag Milkha Bhaag, Asshiqui 2), and so are scenic locales (in films such as Cocktail, Chandni Chowk to China).

Data:

Animation will approximately be Rs. 9,550 - 10,000 crore industry by 2020.

The growth in this sector in the last few years has been massive. According to FICCI (Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry) –KPMG (Klynveld Peat Marwick Geordeler), animation, VFX and post-production in India grew from 31% CAGR (Compound Annual Growth Rate) in 2011 to 51% CAGR in 2015.

India's animation industry alone generated revenue of Rs. 4,490 crore in 2014, which is a 13% rise from 2013. The sector will most likely be double the size (approx Rs. 9,550 crore) by 2020.

The process:

Creating VFX isn't as cool and easy as it looks. Though the output looks magnificent on the 70mm wide screen, to bring it to life is a difficult/laborious process.

VFX planning begins when a movie is conceptualized and is intricately involved throughout until it's ready. The module differs with every film depending on its scale and budget, but a typical VFX movie workflow includes 3D modeling, UV unwrapping (UV mapping), texturing, rigging, rotoscoping and projection mapping.



Little progress:

But, Indian films still look like low standard/cheap-copies of Hollywood movies.



Yes, VFX is being used more than ever in Indian films but despite the technological progress, they still look like cheap, uninspired copies of Hollywood movies.

There are two reasons for this. First, our films lack originality and imagination. And in the rare instances when they don't (take Baahubali film for example), the VFX/effects got overboard, using CGI in scenes that don't need them.



Outsource haven:

Indian VFX artists mostly do outsourced cheap clerical works.

Second, most of the VFX and animation houses in India do labor-intensive work that's outsourced to them by Western production studios mostly because they are cheap labor. According to FICCI - KMPG 2012 report, animation production in India costs one-fourth of what it does in the US.

The increase in the amount of work, therefore, has failed to translate into a corresponding improvement in quality.

Details:

We can work with Hollywood productions, but never match them.

Indian animators can, at best, create



crowd scenes and props for TV series like Game of Thrones, and provide VFX for films like Disney's Maleficent but can never produce such content themselves, at least not in the current scenario.

Yes, we don't have the necessary technology and money, but we don't have the needed talent or creativity either. According to the recent TOI report, only 40% of the Indian animators are capable of creative output.

The future:

Experts hopeful about the scope of animation in Indian films.



Despite slow progress, industry experts hope that the increase in the volume of work will eventually result in quality improvement.

The current budget allocation on VFX is 10-15% which is eventually expected to jump up to 30-35% in the near future. The number of CGI shots used by Indian filmmakers in their movies has also rapidly shot up from earlier 100-500 to 1,500-2,000 shots now, especially in the big-budget films.
