ARTICLE 370 REPEALED; JAMMU AND KASHMIR INCISED INTO TWO UNION TERRITORIES

Majority of us thought that The Paradise on Earth i.e. J&K was a part of India totally and completely before Article 370 was revoked. But most of us got to know very recently that J&K merged into the Union of India in the year 1947 with an agreement i.e. Article 370.

What is Article 370?

Article 370 of the Indian constitution gave special status to Jammu and Kashmir, conferring it with the power to have separate constitution, a state flag and autonomy over the internal administration of the state. It gave most of the power to the government of this state. Centre was left with limited power over J&K.

On 5th August 2019, The government stunned everyone by saying it was revoking all of the article 370, of which 35A is a part and has been the basis of Kashmir's complex relationship with India for some 70 years. President of India issued a constitutional order superseding the 1954 order, and making all the provisions of the Indian constitution applicable to Jammu and Kashmir based on the resolution passed in both houses of parliament with 2/3 majority.

This says that Kashmir will no longer have a separate constitution but will have to abide by the Indian constitution much like any other state. All the Indian laws will be automatically applicable to Kashmiris, and people from outside the state will be able to buy property there.

Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019 This act bifurcated J&K into two smaller, federally administered territories. One region will combine Muslim-majority Kashmir and Hindumajority Jammu. The other is Buddhist-majority Ladakh, which is culturally and historically close to Tibet. Jammu and Kashmir will have a legislature and Ladakh without a legislature.

Article 370 has recently been scrapped making it a historic event which is expected to change the face of the state for good. This move has received mixed reactions from political parties and general public though it has largely been appreciated.

The residents of J&K fear that the scrapping of Article 370 may hamper their local business and thus be a threat to their livelihood. Adapting to the changes that are likely to follow this big decision also seems to be a cause of concern for the residents of J&K. Their concerns are genuine.

There are miles to go! Whether the decision taken by Centre is right or wrong is still being debated. We hope it proves to be beneficial for the state as well as the country as whole. We hope things change for good for this beautiful state which has long struggled for peace and justice. The Centre must make special efforts to make J&K a better and safer place to live.

Article 35A allows the Jammu and Kashmir legislature to define permanent residents of the state. It was inserted through the Constitution Order, 1954, which was issued by President Rajendra Prasad under Article 370, on the advice of the Nehru-led Union Government.

Induction, 2019



Movie Review

Avengers: Endgame

To start with a brief introduction- Avengers Endgame is a super hero film and the fourth sequel of the avengers' film series. The film is produced by Marvel studios, a subsidiary of the Walt Disney Pictures Co. and is directed by Joe and Antony Russo also known as the Russo brothers. This pair has previously directed three other movies in the marvel cinematic universe prior to endgame - Captain America: The winter soldier; Captain America: Civil War and The Avengers: Infinity War. Endgame can also be referred as the second part of infinity war.

Starting off with a bang at the box office and breaking records, it is pretty much self-explanatory that the film has created a great impact on the audience with earning over a billion dollars in the first 3 days of release worldwide. It can be referred to as the perfect end to the Marvel Cinematic Universe as its 22nd film and marks the end of the infinity saga. Different from its prequel, Infinity war, this film touches more on the emotional side of the audience rather than its benchmarked action sequences. Tuesdays with Morrie is one of those books that you gulp down like coffee. The book itself isn't very big - about 180 pages, but the lessons Morrie gives out are numerous and priceless.

Mitch Albom, the author of the book was privileged enough to have studied Social Psychology under his professor, Morrie. The book intends to explore the beautiful friendship that Albom and Morrie develop when Morrie contracts Lou Gehrig's disease.


Morrie is one of the few people that Albom looks up to. Though he promises to keep in touch with Morrie, Mitch doesn't really make efforts for a very long time. The author justifies this, saying that people get busy in life and lose track of the things that really matter.

Mitch learns of Morrie's disease and subsequently shortened life through a televised interview. Guilt takes over Mitch's everyday routine and he decides it's time he visited his old professor, his old friend.

Expecting Morrie to be angry, Mitch shows up at his place - 16 years after he promised to stay in touch. Tears flow down Mitch's cheeks when Morrie embraces his old student and whispers "My old friend, you've come at last".

Lessons about Life

Morrie seems to have accepted the fact that his time here is drawing to an end. He doesn't seem to disturbed about death; at least not as much as he is about his dependence on others. This draws an interesting parallel for Mitch - he is scared to death of death!





Morrie asks Mitch if he wants to learn lessons about life from a dying man, to which Mitch replies positively almost instantly. They decide to meet once a week, and the title of the book begins to make sense. Mitch spends his Tuesdays with Morrie, in Morrie's last stint as a teacher; a facilitator. Mitch is the only student in the class and the lessons are all about life. "There were no tests, no exams. There was, however, one long paper that was due at the end of this course.." This book is Mitch's "one long paper".

The book doesn't tell you how you should live - it only tells you how you can make life better. The book is very well written, so much so that the reader feels that he's sitting with Mitch and Morrie - taking his last lecture; learning lessons of life from a dying man.

Morrie's narrative is uninterrupted, complete with anecdotes from his life. In a country like ours, it gets almost impossible to form friendships with one's teachers. Why? Read Tuesdays with Morrie - and go visit the one teacher this book reminds you of. Give your teachers the love they deserve.

cellular trafficking in Dendritic Cells. We generated a knockout mouse where cellular protein Fam21 was specifically knocked in Dendritic Cells. I am studying how the knockout of a protein Fam21 involved in cellular trafficking affects the function of Dendritic Cells. The faculty at Aurora Dr. S. Ravi Kiran and Prof. Nambiar gave me the initial push that was needed for me to realize my dream. The faculty encouraged me to participate in conferences, present posters, perform small projects after classes and helped me contact Osmania University faculty to learn some new techniques, Ravi Kiran sir was always around like a big brother guiding me. Without that kind of initial help it would have been difficult for me to reach this far in research.

Q5) What role has Aurora played in shaping up your personality and making you the person that you are today?

Not just subject learning but the mental toughness needed for handling failures and facing challenges in life were taught during my stay at Aurora. There is one incident which I can never forget, at Aurora. My motivation was completely down as Life Sciences students were not getting enough placements in our field and I started attending interviews of companies from other fields. That's when I came across our ex-principal, Dr. Ravi

Paturi, and current principal, Dr. Viswanadam Bulusu, who advised me to stick to my choice of career even though it was difficult initially. They told me that if I gave up then and changed my career I would always do that in my life whenever I face a hurdle or a tough task. It took few months but ultimately I got a chance to pursue the career of my choice. Those words are helpful till date and every time I face a failure or tough task I recollect that incident.

Q6) Tell about your Life at Aurora

Life at Aurora was always joyful. Not just the classroom the canteen, surroundings like the tea stalls and restaurants were a great place to hangout with friends. We still miss the time spent at Aurora. So I make sure every time I visit India I visit our college, meet the faculty and spend some time around the college with friends.

Q7) What made you choose science among other fields?

To be able to cure a disease and save a person always fascinated me. To see my close family member and a friend die due to lack of sufficient treatment for cancer encouraged me to take up research. To either become a physician or a scientist and to help people cure diseases was always on my mind from childhood.

Q8) What is the future in taking up science?

Future in Science is always bright as there are many unanswered questions and many new emerging questions which have to be addressed. For me the most challenging ones are the bugs which keep mutating and pose a threat of sudden outbreak. Be it frequently mutating viruses, antibiotic resistant bacteria, or new emerging pathogens, they all can be life threatening. Apart from the Core Biology, Science has been

very inter-disciplinary for years, be it the use of Physics to develop sophisticated tools like Microscope to study the tiny microorganisms invisible to a naked eye, or chemistry to develop drugs and recently the use of artificial intelligence (AI) in medicine, there are many areas to explore.

Q9) Can you share your achievements in Aurora?

I got the Star of Excellence Award in 2009 and the Best Poster Award at a National conference in 2008.

Q10) Your message to present Aurorans.

My message to Aurorans is not to look at the shallow benefits of jobs and change careers, look at the big picture. Before changing careers, recollect why you chose a certain career in the first place. If a field is your passion and you enjoy doing it, persist in that. You might face failures while working for your goals, but overcoming them will make you a better person than running away from the failures.

Passion for Wildlife Photography

- K Anurag Reddy, Department of Humanities

I had a zeal for wildlife photography since childhood. I've admired the work of wildlife photographers, watching countless replays of wildlife documentaries the TV channels had to offer back then, and browsing through the pages of National Geographic magazine, over and over again. For as long as I can recall, I was fascinated with wild animals and spent hours reading about their habitat, food habits and life. At the end of the day, that's why I pursue wildlife photography because the subject itself fascinates me. The elements of photography that are enmeshed within that, the technical elements of cameras and lenses and digital processing, the compositional rules of visual arts, the creative desire, the goal of making a great photo, are all secondary. For me, wildlife photography is all about the subject.

It's this elusive pursuit of beauty that makes wildlife photography both challenging and rewarding. Unlike the controlled environments common in zoos and farms, wildlife is fleeting. Since most moments last just a few short seconds, there is little room for error when the subject appears. While patience, persistence, and a touch of luck certainly are helpful, they're not sufficient to achieve consistent results.

Wildlife Photography "Beyond the Perfect Portrait"

Study Your Subject:

Wildlife photography is about so much more than technical details like aperture and shutter



speed. It also goes well beyond the technology in today's latest and HD cameras. In order to capture a subject's true beauty, it's essential to understand their behavior and determine the best time of day and month to see the wildlife. While it may be impossible to predict all of nature's variables, understanding your subject before heading out is one sure way to separate yourself from the pack.

Expect the Unexpected

Wildlife waits for no one so you must be ready to shoot in an instant. As soon as you arrive at a location, take the cameras out of your backpack, turn them on, and remove the lens caps. This way, you are prepared for anything that may cross your path. By expecting the unexpected, you won't be caught off guard.

Technical Photography Tips

One of the most common issues facing wildlife photographers is how to get enough light into the camera while using a fast shutter speed. Ideally, you want to be at 1/1000 to freeze the action. Anything slower than 1/500, you increase the likelihood of blurry images due to subject motion. Of course, no amount of post-



production work can correct a blurry photo. To minimize the possibility of camera shake, use a tripod and ball head that are specifically designed to support the weight of your longer lenses. Once it's on this stable platform, connect a cable release so you don't have to touch the camera to press the shutter. By using this long lens technique every time, you can be confident that your images will be tack sharp.

Timing Is Everything

There is nothing in this world that does not have a decisive moment. This same idea can certainly be applied to wildlife photography. When you locate a subject you are interested in, it's tempting to immediately shoot a handful of pictures and move on. I recommend you to slow down, and watch through the lens while studying the animal's behavior. Rather than settling for a static shot of a bird standing motionless, wait for a dynamic moment, to start shooting.

Often, it takes a few minutes for an animal to realize you are not a threat to their safety. Once they settle down, they will resume their natural

activities. To avoid disturbing your subject, make slow deliberate movements, avoid direct eye contact, and wear muted colors.

Show The Environment

Don't be afraid to show some of the environment which surrounds your subject. You will also be adding a sense of showcasing the natural world surrounding them. If there are too many distracting elements behind the subject, you will draw attention away from the wild animal/subject.

Creating a beautiful image of an elusive creature is an exciting challenge for all the nature / wildlife photographers. As fleeting as these moments are, you can relive the experiences through photos you are proud to

Phrases Coined by William Shakespeare

The Bard may be long gone but his influence on the English language persists hundreds of years after he penned his last work. William Shakespeare created new words and phrases all the time for his plays and poetry, and a lot of them surprisingly still persist today. When we're not making use of his plot tropes, we're throwing his quotes and words into our everyday language!

Here are 8 popular phrases you probably didn't know came from Shakespeare.

1. "Off with his head" - Richard III

Lewis Carroll's feisty character, the Queen of Hearts, might enjoy using this phrase quite liberally in Alice's Adventures in Wonderland, but she wasn't actually the first! Shakespeare used this phrase in his play Richard III, and, given the Bard's penchant for gory & bloody endings.

2. "Green-eyed monster" - Othello

Shakespeare came up with the phrase "greeneyed monster" in his play Othello as a way to describe jealousy. Prior to this, the color green was mostly associated with illness.

3. "Love is blind" - The Merchant of Venice

Technically, Shakespeare wasn't the first to use the phrase "love is blind", but he is the one who made it popular by using it in The Merchant of Venice. These days we still use the phrase quite a bit, especially when talking about unlikely couples!

4. "The game is afoot" - Henry V

The famous phrase "The game is afoot" is associated with Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's brilliant detective, Holmes. But, he didn't actually say it first. It comes from Shakespeare's Henry V, as both characters have one thing in common: they tend to come upon dead bodies rather frequently.

5. "Wild goose chase" - Romeo and Juliet

No one likes being sent on a wild goose chase. Shakespeare used the phrase wild goose chase in Romeo and Juliet, and while the phrase might seem a trifle upbeat and humorous for such a tragic tale, it actually doesn't have anything to do with geese! It is a pursuit of something.

6. "Seen better days" - As You Like It

Shakespeare seemed rather fond of this phrase because he used it in not one, but two different plays: As You Like It and Timon of Athens.

7. "Good riddance" - Troilus and Cressida

Shakespeare was a master of heated language, and there was nothing he loved more than a good verbal feud. The phrase is most often used to indicate good riddance to something bad, irritating, or annoying. If it weren't for Shakespeare we'd have nothing to shout at terrible roommates, exes, and family members!

8. "Lie low" - Much Ado About Nothing

Long before "lie low" was the go-to advice for mob bosses, criminals, and scandal-ridden celebrities, it was a line in Shakespeare's endearing Much Ado About Nothing. Back then, it didn't actually mean to stay underneath the radar. It was referring to death!

Shakespeare penned a curse for his grave, daring anyone to move his body from that final resting place. His epitaph was:

Good friend for Jesus' sake forbear, To dig the dust enclosed here: Blest be the man that spares these stones,

And curst be he that moves my bones.

Though it was customary to dig up the bones from previous graves to make room for others, the remains in Shakespeare's grave are still undisturbed.
